1. Overview of Sustainability Weeks 2009

Features of This Year

- Theme : **A Step Toward the Future to Build a Sustainable Society**
- Core period : Sun, November 1 – Wed, November 18, 2009
- Number of events : 33
- Event period : Sun, October 4 – Wed, December 9, 2009
- Number of participants : 8,440
- Points worth special mention:
 - Hokkaido University decided to turn the Sustainability Weeks program into an annual event as part of its efforts to act responsibly in line with the Sapporo Sustainability Declaration (SSD), which was adopted in the previous year by 35 leading higher education institutions around the world.
 - The campus-wide International Symposium on Sustainable Development, the second gathering of its kind since 2006, was held to mark the last year of the Strategic Fund for Establishing International Headquarters in Universities, a funding program of the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology to promote university internationalization. Proposals to address five challenges for global sustainability were made based on the Hokkaido University Initiative for Sustainable Development (HUISD), which was implemented with the funding.
 - Hokkaido University invited the presidents of its partner institutions to join the SW 2009 in order to strengthen partnerships with them, and ultimately hosted presidents and vice-presidents from five institutions. It also cohosted joint symposiums with seven institutions.
 - Institutions represented by their president: the Portland State University, the University of Nigeria
 - Institutions represented by their vice-president: Peking University, the City of Paris Industrial Physics and Chemistry Higher Educational Institution (ESPCI), the Politecnico di Torino
 - Institutions cohosting symposiums: the Asian Institute of Technology, the University of Alaska, De La Salle University, the University of Geneva, University of Oulu, the University of Palangkaraya, the Politecnico di Torino
 - As in the previous year, a carbon offset initiative was undertaken.

- The first Hokkaido University Sustainability Research Poster Contest was held as part of efforts to increase the number of students participating in the Sustainability Weeks and offer the opportunity for experts in different fields to share their research findings. The event attracted 72 teams of Hokkaido University students.

For a little over 130 years since its establishment as Sapporo Agricultural College in 1876, Hokkaido University has striven to create a society in which humans thrive in harmony with nature. Last year, we hosted the G8 University Summit (the first-ever gathering of presidents of major universities in G8 and other nations) and contributed greatly to the adoption of the [Sapporo Sustainability Declaration \(SSD\)](#). The SSD embodied the pledge of 20 overseas universities, 1 U.N. organization, and 14 Japanese universities to serve as a positive force toward the creation of a sustainable society.

Using [SSD](#) as a foundation, we will present solutions based on scientific knowledge at an even more accelerated pace. To this end, we will host Sustainability Weeks 2009. This is a promotional week of research and education to help create a sustainable society. During the weeks, an intensive program of international symposia, lectures for citizens, and exhibitions will be held to present the results of the research and educational programs we have implemented to date. We will also invite researchers who are at the forefront of their fields from around the world to explore solutions through animated discussions.

In 2005, the Hokkaido University Initiative for Sustainable Development (HUISD) was established and we hosted the International Symposia on Sustainable Development in 2006. Since 2007, Sustainability Weeks has been held every year with a set of new goals. This year marks the third Sustainability Weeks and will focus on the reinforcement of our network with overseas partnership institutions and the expansion of student participation. We plan to welcome many individuals from overseas partner institutions to present the latest results of their research activities, and we will provide opportunities for them to engage in discussions with both young and veteran researchers from our university and the citizens of Sapporo. By doing so, Hokkaido University can foster the impetus toward sustainability as we renew our commitment to this most important of tasks through Sustainability Weeks 2009.

Int'l Symposium "Toward a Sustainable Low Carbon Society -Green New Deal and Global Change-"

- a We will discuss from the view point of Social Science and Natural Science ways toward establishing a Sustainable Low-Carbon Society.
Day 1: Green New Deal Nov.4 9:30-18:00
The international community is facing a financial and environmental crisis, which demands an integrated solution incorporating environmental measures. Thus the New Green Deal program was proposed by US President Obama and other countries like China, the EU, Korea and Japan advocated the idea. The national policies of these countries will be reviewed and assessed along with global and local policies, and potential global cooperation will be discussed.
Day 2: Global Change Nov.5 9:30-19:00
The positive feedback between ecosystems and climate systems via geochemical components will impact biological resources. We will discuss distinct indices of urgent issues, such as sea ice melting in the Arctic, and explore ways of publicizing the information of how this seriously impacts society so that global citizens can make informed decisions in response to what the indices forewarn.

Open Lecture "The 2nd Int'l Symposium on Sentinel Earth"

- a Recently, research themes on the drastic changes in the climate that the global environment is undergoing has gained a sense of urgency. In particular, drastic changes have happened in the Arctic because the climate and environment of the polar region has kept the balance among various factors for a long time. Therefore, we need to observe the changes in the climate and environment as it occurred in the Arctic over a long period of time in order to understand polar phenomena and its influence on the global environment. 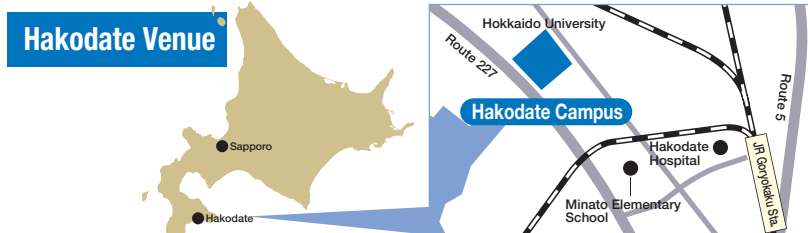

Overview of Sustainability Weeks 2009

Hokkaido University's Sustainability Weeks, with this year marking the third in the series, has grown into a unique social contribution and international exchange opportunity without parallel among universities in terms of its coverage of many academic fields and challenges. It has now become a signature event of Hokkaido University.

The related exchanges ran for approximately two weeks from November 1 (Sunday) through 18 (Wednesday) with an intensive program of 28 events, or 33 including pre- and post-events. This year's Sustainability Weeks had three characteristics – a multifaceted approach, solutions of specific issues, and collaborations.

It covered a wide range of topics, including climate and environment change, technological innovation, nature conservation, health, education and human rights. Event styles were also varied – international symposiums, a research poster contest, a debate competition, open lectures, exhibitions, movies, cafés and a fair trade fair. A multifaceted approach was adopted both in terms of themes and of styles. Specific challenges that must be addressed to create a sustainable society were highlighted at the events, and a roadmap to their solutions was presented based on the results of the latest research and activities. The first such opportunity was the opening symposium held on November 2. At this event, we focused on five challenges regarding global sustainability – preventing the spread of infectious diseases, avoiding water-source depletion, securing food and energy supplies, establishing a low-carbon, recycling-oriented society as part of our efforts to combat global warming, and promoting the sustainable development of the Sea of Okhotsk – the lifeline of East Asia – and its basin areas. In relation to these issues, we will propose insightful next steps from the viewpoint of what should be done now for future generations.

These events were made possible by the cooperation of our partners, who were from a wide variety of sectors at home and abroad. These included overseas partner institutions and other domestic/overseas universities keen on creating a sustainable society, as well as international organizations (such as the World Health Organization and the United Nations University), elements of the scholarly community (such as academic conferences and societies), NPOs and government-affiliated organizations (such as the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, the Ministry of the Environment and the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism). This year's Sustainability Weeks was successfully brought to an end with the support of a total of 6,500 participants and collaborators.

This year, we sent invitations to the presidents of all our partner institutions in April 2009 in order to deepen our cooperation with them; the subsequent participation of 28 institutions from 16 countries indicated a high level of interest in the theme of sustainability among them. We held joint symposiums with the Asian Institute of Technology (Thailand), the University of Oulu (Finland), the University of Palangkaraya (Indonesia), the Politecnico di Torino (Italy), De La Salle University (the Philippines), the University of Geneva (Switzerland) and the University of Alaska (U.S.). We also had the honor of having the President of Portland State University deliver a keynote speech entitled Roles of the Urban University in Pursuit of Sustainability at the opening symposium. What's more, the President of the University of Nigeria and the Vice-Presidents of the City of Paris Industrial Physics and Chemistry Higher Educational Institution (ESPCI), Peking University and the Politecnico di Torino visited our institution to participate in the Sustainability Weeks. We took these opportunities to exchange views with them to further deepen our cooperation in efforts to achieve sustainability in the future.

To encourage students to participate the Weeks, we held the First Hokkaido University Sustainability Research Poster Contest on the day of the Opening Symposium (November 2). Despite being the first such attempt, we received a total of 72 entries, making us realize once again that many students are engaged in issues concerning the creation of a sustainable society. Their outstanding work was examined by judges from Hokkaido University and outside, and the First Hokkaido University Sustainability Poster Awards were presented to the selected winners at an award ceremony held on the same evening. Furthermore, five of the student organizations selected as Hokudai GENKI Projects (aimed at improving campus life) also participated in the Sustainability Weeks, and more students than last year attended as a result.

The results of questionnaires distributed to participants indicated a growing recognition of the Sustainability Weeks as an event unique to Hokkaido University and expectations for its continued development. Next year, we plan to hold the Sustainability Weeks 2010 over a period of approximately two weeks from October 25 (Monday). We will provide a better forum to encourage discussion and action toward the resolution of specific issues with an even greater number of participants and collaborators.
