## PREFACE

Sapporo Agricultural College was founded in 1872 for the purpose of training pioneering youths who aimed at the exploitation of Hokkaido. Later this school became the Agricultural College of the Tohoku University.

In 1910 the Zootechnical Department within the Agricultural College was established as a higher educational organization of veterinary science and zootechny. In 1918, the Agricultural College became independent as the Faculty of Agriculture in the Hokkaido Imperial university.

Thus the Zootechnical Department is one of the oldest University schools of veterinary science. It ranks with the corresponding school in the Tokyo University. The graduates of the period 1910~1953 number more than 400.

In Japan, veterinary education is still undertaken under the veterinary section of the Faculty of Agriculture in all the other 9 government schools including the Tokyo University. Since the war, the improvement of veterinary education became a focal point in problems connected with the promotion and reestablishment of the livestock industry and also public health. In order to promote this eager desire to develop the livestock industry, in April 1952, the Department of Veterinary Science in the Faculty of Agriculture was elevated to an independent Faculty of Veterinary Medicine. It is fully expected that several additional Professorial chairs will be established within a few years. Now, this Faculty stands in the central part of Hokkaido where the livestock industry is most flourishing in Japan. There are plenty of veterinary subjects for study and the staff members are actively making investigations along their respective lines.

Unfortunately, the publication of the results of their research work through the "Japanese Journal of Veterinary Science" is rather restricted and likely to be delayed many months. Hence, we have decided to undertake the publication of "Veterinary Research" in quarterly form as the official organ of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine. It is now our great pleasure to send this first number to our fellow students across the sea.

We earnestly wish your friendly encouragement and advise in order to nourish the growth of our journal, "Veterinary Research", and our newly established Faculty of Veterinary Medicine for the development of livestock well-being and for the welfare of the human race.
