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1. Overview of Sustainability Weeks 2012

Features of This Year

- Theme : **A Future Society Offering Peace Of Mind For All**
- Core period : Sat, October 6 – Sun, October 21, 2012
- Number of events : 36
- Event period : Sat, September 1– Fri, November 30, 2012
- Number of participants : 5,843
- Points worth special mention:
 - Taking into account the periods in which the Sustainability Weeks were previously organized, the Committee of the Sustainability Weeks, headed by the University's president, decided to fix the core period of the Sustainability Weeks from the last week of October to the first week of November.
 - As part of the preparations for the sixth annual Sustainability Weeks, the Secretariat for Sustainability Weeks invited the public to submit official logo designs and received 197 submissions from across Japan. The logo, selected via internal screening and combining the phrase Sustainability Weeks in English and Japanese, was registered as a trademark, which will be valid until July 12, 2023.
 - The total numbers of events and participants in SW over the last six years, including this year, topped 200 and 50,000, respectively.
 - For the first time in the six-year history of the Sustainability Weeks, events were held outside of Japan: in Finland, Indonesia, Burkina Faso and Nepal. In those events, participants including, but not limited to, researchers, college students and representatives of not-for-profit organizations from those countries and their neighboring countries had lively discussions based on the year's theme.
 - Hokkaido University Library, a United Nations Depository Library, held a forum for the first time as part of the Sustainability Weeks program to promote the global *Stand Up Take Action* campaign to eradicate poverty. It attracted 85 students, faculty, administrative members and local residents.

In 2012, the official logo of the Hokkaido University Sustainability Weeks (SW) event was unveiled, and the sixth SW program was held with a fresh spirit of enthusiasm. Based on the theme of A Future Society Offering Peace of Mind for All, the event provided a forum for discussions to mitigate or eliminate concerns such as the unstable state of international affairs, including the threat of natural disasters and energy problems that affect everybody's lives.

The SW 2012 program began on October 6, coinciding with the first annual Homecoming Day for alumni. The program featured 15 events (or 36 including pre- and post-program sessions) over the 16-day period until October 21.

Summary

The SW 2012 program attracted people from a wide range of academic disciplines, and the events held addressed five general sub-themes:

(1) Models for a Sustainable Society: 9 events

Events to support the proposal of a future society that offers peace of mind for all while harnessing the full potential of Hokkaido

(2) Expanding a Cooperative Network: 5 events

Events to support the enhancement of trans-border cooperation

(3) Quality of Life: 10 events

Events to support the creation of a community whose members enjoy physical, mental and social well-being as well as a high quality of life

(4) Harmony with Nature: 3 events

Events to support the pursuit of balance with earth's natural systems and the appreciation of nature's blessings

(5) Learning for the Future: 9 events

Events to support the sharing of common awareness regarding issues and wisdom while nurturing empathy, energy and friendship to pave the way to a new future

Value of the Sustainability Weeks program

The events held during the Sustainability Weeks program are varied. Those provided every year with steadily progressing discussions include: the Seminar on Environmental Policy co-hosted by the Hokkaido University Public Policy School and the Graduate School of Environmental Science; Sustainable Sanitation and the Environment and Human Health Risk Management (a symposium hosted by the Faculty of Engineering); and the Seminar on the Development of Geo-spatial Information hosted by the Graduate School of Letters. Other events are newly incorporated into the program, such as STAND UP TAKE ACTION in Hokudai hosted by the University Library, seminars held for the first time in several years, and biyearly symposiums not held in 2012. All these events are hosted on the single platform of the Sustainability Weeks program.

This system is adopted because holding events on a single platform produces results different from those gained by arranging them separately. Such outcomes include accelerated identification of issues shared with other academic disciplines, enhancement of HU's visibility in Japan and the international community, and visualization of HU's human and intellectual resources. Particularly noteworthy among these effects is the provision of catalogues detailing HU's social contribution programs to underline the social responsibilities fulfilled by the university in its efforts to address the challenges facing society today. This highlights the value of the Sustainability Weeks program and its worth as a campus-wide event.

For the Future

Since 2005, HU has upheld the theme of sustainable development as part of its international strategy, and this philosophy gave rise to the Sustainability Weeks program in 2007. Against the backdrop of the event's introduction was HU's aspiration to increase its presence in the international community as a university responding to worldwide demand. Now, 2014 will be the last year of the United Nations Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (UNDESD), and 2015 is the target year for the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). We are entering an era in which the achievements of

universities will be examined as part of efforts to tackle global challenges toward the creation of a better future.

With this in mind, HU plans to summarize its achievements during the Sustainability Weeks 2013 event ahead of global trends to identify pointers for directions to take beyond 2015 and contribute to the international community.

Conclusion

The Sustainability Weeks program is held over a fixed period for the convenience of event planners. In 2013 it will run from the last week of October to the first week of November, with an opening event on the Saturday immediately before this period begins; the specific dates of the event are therefore Saturday October 26 to Sunday November 3.

The program will be organized more effectively than ever as an assembly opportunity for leaders involved in creating sustainable societies around the world and as a chance for HU attendees to present the achievements of their initiatives on campus and elsewhere for evaluation. The continued support and contribution of everybody involved is highly appreciated.
