DISCOVERY OF *EUTORNICUS PLANATUS*
MARSHALL IN FORMOSA

(Col., Curculionidae)

Through the courtesy of Mr. TAKEHIKO NAKANE of the Biological Laboratory, Saikyo University, Kyoto, I have had the opportunity to examine specimens belonging to the Cossoninae. Among these specimens I have found the following species which is new to Formosa.

Eutornicus planatus (MARSHALL)

Eutornus planatus MARSHALL, Arb. morph. taxon. Ent., 5(2), p. 161-163 (1938).

This species was originally described from Pha Rang and Phuc-Son, Annam.

Specimens examined: Formosa, 6 males & 6 females (without definite date), in NAKANE's coll.; Tokyo, Japan, 1 male & 1 female, 2. XII, 1950, in coll. of Tokyo Branch, Yokohama Plant Quarantine Station (introduced from Formosa with bananas kept in bombo-baskets); Sapporo, Japan, 1 female, VI, 1932, H. KÔNO leg. (probably introduced from Formosa).

According to Mr. NAKANE the Formosan specimens examined attack bamboo shoots.
